Binger Hermann, ex-Congressman and ex-Commissioner of the General Land Office, will be tried in Portland in October. Hermann will be prosecuted by Francis Joseph Heney in person.

Although there are persistent reports that Hermann's case will never come to trial, the Government officials at the Federal building assert that these reports are without foundation. For several weeks past negotiations have been in progress looking to the trial of Binger Hermann. The evidence, documentary, to be introduced in the case, is in the keeping of Thomas B. Neuhausen, Special Inspector of the Interior Department. This evidence has been boxed up for more than three years. As soon as the date of the trial is determined, Neuhausen will have to open the boxes of evidence and arrange it for use of the prosecution.

Binger Hermann was indicted with a number of other prominent politicians, all of whom have been tried with the exception of Hermann. He asked for and received a separation and this has been dragging on now for years. Heney is taking a particular interest in the Hermann case, as this and the case of ex-Congressman J. N. Williamson are the only two of the remaining land-fraud cases which have not been turned over by Heney to Becker for prosecution.

Morris E. Preston, the convicted murderer, serving 25 years in the Nevada state prison, who was nominated for the presidency of the United States by the Socialist-Labor party, is preparing to make a campaign by mail. The warden at the prison has given Preston permission to spend a portion of his time in political campaigning.

Since the arrival of Preston's mother and sister at Carson the prisoner has renewed his fight for a new trial, which he is confident would acquit him of the crime for which he is now serving time.

Work has begun at Echo on a \$25,000 alfalfa meal mill, which is being erected by J. E. Murphy, of Portland. The structure will be fireproof, without a bit of wood in it, and the mill will have a capacity of 25 tons every 24 hours, and will employ ten men. Murphy has also taken a five-year lease on the Henriette Flour Mills at that place and will operate them in connection with the alfalfa mill.

The department of agriculture has set itself to the popularizing of venison. Officials of the biological survey are preparing a bulletin on deer farming. According to experts deer are easily and cheaply raised and require but little care while their meat commands a high market price.

It is stated that it will cost \$50,000 to formally notify the national candidates of their nomination. It would be just as effective to use the mails and save the money for campaign buttons.
