For a time it appeared as if this might be a lively meeting, but the indications at this time are that the meeting will be a comparatively tame affair and that the directors will be confronted only by routine business. It was understood a short time ago that the landowners in the Upper project would present a petition to the board asking for the cancellation of their contracts with the government. The directors could take no definite action on the matter, but the recommendation of the board would count with the Secretary of the Interior if the matter were passed up to him.

It now appears that the petition will not be presented and that the meeting will be devoted to the transaction of regular business and a general discussion of the welfare of the project.
