Light & Water Company Completing Additions to Water System.

The two large reservoirs that are being constructed by the Light & Water company will be completed in the near future. The one on the Hot Springs tract is now in the hands of the workmen doing the rock work and concreting will be begun in about ten days.

The excavation for the one on the West Side is practically completed and a force of men will begin on the rock lining the latter part of this week.

The construction of the reservoirs and the pipe line leading up to them will be rushed by the company so that the system can be all connected up in the early fall.
