**Will Move Dredge
To Wood River**

The Adams dredge has about completed the reclamation of the experimental farm. There remain but a few days work on the dikes and then the finishing touches. The work would have been completed some time ago had it not been that it was temporarily dropped to use the machine in opening the head of the old Adams canal so that it would flow more water. The dredge, as soon as it completes the reclamation of the experimental farm, will be taken to the Upper lake and will be placed on the snow and towed to Wood river to begin work on the Weed canal.

Senator Weed is now in the city and he and Mr. Adams, who arrived here this morning, are completing all arrangements to begin work on the ditch as soon as the machinery can be moved. This canal, several miles in length, is being built by Mr. Weed in order to keep the flood waters of Wood river from inundating his valuable grazing lands.
