W. L. Ford, who is supplying milk from the Altamont Dairy, states that he will not be able to make a delivery of milk tonight on account of the shortage of milk. There is almost a milk famine in Klamath Falls as it is impossible to secure sufficient to supply the families of the city on account of many of the farmers making butter. Mr. Ford is making an effort to get a larger supply and he states that he expects to be able to furnish more milk soon. He has had an offer of about 20 gallons of cream a day and if he can find sufficient patrons to use this amount, he will make a contract for it.
