

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, General Land Office, Washington, D. C., August 21, 1908. NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT OF PUBLIC LANDS TO SETTLEMENT AND ENTRY. Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of the Interior has issued departmental order of withdrawal in so far as the same affects withdrawal for irrigation purposes under the act of June 17, 1902 (Stat., 388), for use in connection with the Klamath Project, Oregon, of the following described lands of the State of Oregon, and by his authority such of said tracts as have not been heretofore finally restored and are not otherwise withdrawn, reposed, or appropriated, will be subject to settlement under the public land laws of the United States on and after November 28, 1908, but will not be subject to entry, filing, selection until December 28, 1908.
