#### "BIG 4" KERN.

The speech of William R. Hearst, delivered at the Shrine Auditorium, in Los Angeles, Monday was devoted almost entirely to an attack upon John W. Kern, Democratic candidate for Vice President.

He referred to the recent finding of a pass on the Big Four Railroad. made out in the name of Mr. Kern, and pointed out that the Big Four was a branch of the Vanderbilt sysiem, which he said had been successfully prosecuted by the Federal Government for granting rebates to the American Refining Company and fined \$116,000.

He also devoted much attention to Mr. Kern's employment by Thomas Taggart as his attorney and discussed in detail the alleged gambling at French Lick Springs, Ind.

Mr. Hearst read affidavits from two newspaper men who were in attendance at the Democratic National Convention, at Denver, who stated that Mr. Kern said to them that he Mr. Taggart.


