Work on the West Side canal as far as Moore's Power plant is finished and the government began yesterday moving camp. Water has been turned into the canal, but it will take some two weeks to prime and test under the Klamath Project yet attempted by force account.

A number of men working on the Smoke was discovered issuing from west side canal have been laid off, some have been sent to Tule Lake and the remainder have been consigned to work on other sections of the project. Work will commence crew of about 15 men. This work will be under charge of a competent foreman, who will endeavor to enlarge the present outlet sufficient to enable the engineers to determine if the water in the lake can be materially reduced by means of a subterranean passage.

The work on the South Branch canal is sufficiently advanced so that coment work has been started on the headgates where the south branch leaves the main canal and also on the turnouts for the laterals.

The Clear Lake dam work is progressing at a good rate and a large force of men are now building the cement outlet to connect with the headgates and also commencing work
