Preliminary work on the new Cliff
 house, San Francisco's famous sea-
 side resort, which is destined to re-
 place the structure destroyed by fire,
 has begun. The contract for the re-
 building was signed by Emma J.
 Merritt, representing the Sutter estate
 and the San Francisco Rebuilding
 Company. The estimated cost is
 \$425,000.

Under the terms of the contract
 the building must be ready for occu-
 pancy in five months. Application
 has been made to the supervisors for
 permission to blast rocks in the near-
 by Sutter quarry. This stone will be
 used in the construction of the build-
 ing. The new building will be archi-
 tecturally an improvement upon the
 old one. The first story of the struc-
 ture will be on the driveway along
 the cliff, while a basement and sub-
 basement will cling to the cliff, facing
 the ocean.
