MEETING WITH FAVOR.

The Ready Made House Promises to be a Winner.

As predicted in the Herald at the time the announcement was made that J. F. Goeller had signed a contract for the manufacture of ready made houses, they promise to play an important factor in the development of this city and surrounding country. One of the principal objections, and

in fact the only one so far heard, is that they are not adapted to this climate. On this point Mr. Shortt said:

There will be no trouble on that point and the best proof of it will be offered to the people of this city this winter. We propose to erect and furnish one of these houses for exhibition purposes and then everyone will have an opportunity of visiting it at all times of the day and during all kinds of weather. If it is not as cozy and warm as any house in the city, then we will admit that our plan is not feasible. Orders have already been placed for several of the houses and one man is figuring on purchasing thirty of them for use in this city, the delivery to take place next spring. The houses this party expects to purchase will be four and five room structures and will make an important order for the new company if the deal is closed.
