LAND CONTENT IN ITS FOURTH WEEK.

The contest in the Redding Land-office over 140 acres of stone land in the big bond of Pit River entered upon its fourth week Monday morning. The hearing before the register and receiver has not been continuous, as there have been interruptions while waiting for witnesses. The government has submitted all its evidence. H. V. Gates, who seeks a patent on the 140 acres of stone, and the Northern California Power Company, which is contesting his right to receive a patent, are submitting evidence. It is expected that the case will be submitted by the close of the week. As has been stated before, the 140 acres of land in controversy is considered of great value in connection with a projected electrical power enterprise, although so far as the hearing is concerned the land is located for the building stone it contains.—Redding Searchlight.
