> ---HOW SAWDUST IS USED.

Sawdust is one of the puzzling

stuff one-fourth of the log, or even more, may be kerf. Efforts to turn sawdust into pulp for the paper mills have usually been unsuccessful on account of mechanical difficulties in handling. In several European contitries, however, a new way has been found of turning sawdust to account. The sawdust, chiefly pine and fir, is ground with millstones, exactly at n old-time mills made corn meal or wheat or tye flour. Expensive machinery is not required, but it is necessary to take special precantions a against fires which might start from sparks between the mill stones.

Sawdust flour is sold to dynamics factories, to be mixed with nitroglycerin, and forms the body or absoriimportant, manufacturing center, are kept busy meeting this demand.
