Here is something to interest Bible students. It is claimed by a German publication that Isalah, the prophet, foresaw the coming of the Wright brothers and the eventual navigation of the air by man. There is no joke about the matter, from the standpoint of the writer in the German periodical. His argument on the airship development is merely one of a series in which he seeks to show that the prophecies of the ancient Jews are now being fulfilled. If the reader

will turn to the sixtieth chapter of Isalah, the passage will be found in which the old world writer bases his assertion that the prophet knew that men's future activities would not be confined to land and sea. "Who are those that fly as a cloud and as doves to their window?" Isalah asks. Why, the Wright brothers and Count Zeppelin and Farman and a host of others, of course, responds the German student. Pretty soon, the author says, people will actually be flying to church in the very clouds predicted by the prophet. They shall truly fly, we are told, "as doves to their window." We have not called attention to this matter with the intention of starting a discussion, but merely by way of suggesting to the designers of churches now being planned that provision ought to be made on the roofs for accommodating the cloud when it alights. The duty of the church in the future, evidently, will be to bring people down to earth rather than to lift them up from it.
