### THE FEMINE IDEA OF CHURCH FINANCE.

That evening I spent with the pastor, in his barren, comfortless study. He had broken himself down in the service of a debt-laden city church and had come to the country for rest. "Indeed," said he, "the financial problem is a serious one with us. Not that the people get behind with the salary, as is often the case in small churches. My eight hundred dollars comes in promptly every year. But how is it raised? You have seen this afternoon. There are hardly any men left in my church. Regular subscriptions have almost ceased. Why? These deplorable money-making schemes have driven all sound finance out of my church and out of many another as well."

"How were they started?" I enquired.

"Perhaps it was somewhat this way. There were originally a handful of women in the congregation whose husbands and fathers took no stock in religion and would not let them have any money to put in the contribution baskets. So they smuggled cakes and pies and fancy work out of the house, sold them, and gave the money to the church. Presently the other women, not to be outdone, were on hand with their eatables, their albums, and their eternal underwear. They got up a sale and realized a tidy little sum. The men folks felt the financial pressure on them relaxing, took notice, and began to let up on their subscriptions. So it was up to the ladies more and more, until finally things arrived at the pass where you find them today."

### FIRE-PROOFING PAPER.

To make paper fire-proof, whether written, printed, painted or stamped as for hangings, dip it in strong alum water—a saturated solution—and dry thoroughly. Test after the first dipping—if it burns, dip and dry again. Neither color nor quality will be in the least affected; on the contrary, rather improved. I protect my title deeds and insurance policies this way.

### TO KEEP AN IRON HANDLE COOL.

In making iron-holders slip a little piece of asbestos between the outside and the filling. This will also prevent burning through the holder, and the holder will last twice as long.—Delineator.

### INVITING BAKED POTATOES.

May be made by peeling and baking in a hot, quick oven. They may be placed directly in the oven of clean or on a tin pie plate; when brown on one side turn over and the potatoes will be a most tempting dark brown. A moderate oven will make them an unsightly gray, hence the hot oven.—Delineator.

### CURE FOR BURN.

Cut open and scrape a white potato, bind the scraping to the burn. Repeat if the burning sensation returns, which may occur if the burn is very deep. This is unfailing if done properly.—Delineator.

### A FISH TASTE.

To get rid of the taste and smell of fish, baked or fried, wash the vessel they were cooked in well with soap and water, dry it, then seal with boiling vinegar, or vinegar and water.—Delineator.
