WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—President Roosevelt, in a special message to the Senate, declines to permit Attorney General Bonaparte to tell why he has failed to bring action against the United States Steel Corporation on account of the absorption of the Tennessee Coal and Iron Company. This message is a response to a resolution introduced by Senator Culbertson.

SAN FRANCISCO CITY HALL DOME TO BE TORN DOWN.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 6.—A force of workmen today began to demolish the City Hall dome, which was partially stripped to its steel frame by the earthquake in 1906 and which has since stood as a landmark of the destruction wrought by the disaster. The task has been undertaken by an eastern contractor. Four months will be devoted to razing the tower.
