Oregon State Retail Hardware and Implement Dealers Association Lends Support.

The Johnson good roads bill and the convict labor bill received the commendation and official endorsement of the Oregon State Retail Hardware and Implement Dealers' association at the annual banquet of the association in Portland. The banquet was a great success and was attended by all the dealers who have attended the convention.
