> OKLAHOMA CITY, March 29 .-One hundred Creek Indians, balf areeds and negroes, under personal ommand of Chief Crazy Snake, who gilled five officers in a battle Saturlay night, kept up their march on the warpath early today, but were ailing utterly to spread abroad the mor among the people at large that the events in earlier days caused.

Rather, they were retreating beore five companies of determined glaboma militiamen, who were alled out to quell them, in an effort o reach a stronghold in the Tiger dountains before making a final tand against the troops. The millinmen ordered yesterday by Govrnor Haskell as a result of the upising that came after a clash at the ome of Crazy Snake, in which Marand Baum and Deputy Sheriff Odom were killed, and camped for the night t Hickory Hill, the camp which had een hastily evacuated by Crasy inake at their approach. At break of day they moved forward to give lattle to the redskins. Meanwhile the Chief, through the agency of his deepless scouts, had been watching every move and he led his forces away, apparently not daring., or at east not caring, to fight the white oes in the open.

The militiamen at this juncture susped forward at double quick. The ndians were ten miles away from hem, but they were determined that hey should not be allowed to choose the battle ground and thus gain an idvantage. The troops outnumbered the Indians three to one and the officers knew that could the opposing forces meet in the open there could be only one outcome—the indians would have to surrender or be killed.
