The charter commission is still working away on the revision of the city charter. The members report that they consider it necessary to hold an election on extending the boundaries first before a vote is taken on the new charter. In this case three special elections will be necessary. The first election will be to vote on the additions: the second to adopt the charter, and if this is done, a third election will be neccesary to vote bonds for sewers and other improvements.

A petition to extend the city limits has been drawn up and is being circulated. It may be ready to present to the Council at their meeting tohight. If it is and there are a Council will probably order a special election, which will be held after the regular city election. The new charter will not provide for as large a bonded indebtedness as at first contemplated, but it will be made just sufficient to cover the present indebtedness; pay for a sewer system.
