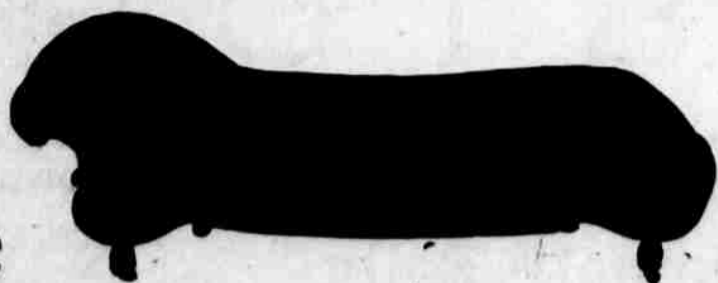

Said Engineer having filed his report with the Police Judge, and the same being satisfactory to the Council, notice is hereby given that at the regular meeting of the Common Council on Monday, the 23rd day of May, 1909, an ordinance will be adopted embodying such report and within 60 days thereafter appraisers will be appointed to appraise the damages, if any, to the owner or owners of the following described parcel of real property, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of 9th street, which is N. 38 degrees 56 minutes E. 60 minutes and N. 51 degrees 04 minutes W. 240 minutes from the S.
