**MANUFACTURERS BUILDING.**

On the eastern side of Geyser Basin, at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition, the handsome Manufacturers Building looks across the rest of the Cascades and the flashing foam of "Old Faithful," the rest of its nameake in Yellowstone National Park.
