THE MARK WAS SET AT \$5000, ONE-FIFTH OF WHICH WOULD HAVE BEEN CONTRIBUTED BY THE HOT SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT COMPANY.

HERETOFORE IT HAS BEEN THE CUSTOM TO TAKE UP A SUBSCRIPTION FOR EVERY-THING THAT CAME AROUND. WHAT HAS EEEN THE RESULT? THE BUSINESS MEN OF THIS CITY HAVE BEEN CONTRIBUTING FAR MORE THAN \$5000 A YEAR, WITH VERY POOR RESULTS. NOW IT IS PROPOSED TO PLACE ALL OF THIS IN THE HANDS OF A RESPONSIBLE ORGANIZA-TION AND HOLD IT AUCOUNTABLE FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE FUNES. WHAT WAS THE FESULT, THEN? WHEN A COMMUTTEE OF EXSINESS MEN TOOK THE SUES RIPHUM CONTRACTS AROUND THEY WELL GIVEN A MUST DISCOURTEDUS RECEPTIO , TO USE MILD LANGUAGE. THE MOLE SO FROM THOSE WHO W. ULD DE BENEFITED THE MOST. AS IN ALL OTHER MATTERS THELE WAS A LIMIT, AND THAT HAS BEEN REACHED.
