Will Consider Occupation Tax

The City Council will meet in adjourned session this evening, when the proposed occupation tax will be considered. The ordinance has been passed to its second reading, but it is not probable that it will be disposed of tonight, as there are many amendments to be made. The rates for license or tax to be charged to the several businesses and occupations have not been settled.

This matter will take a considerable time to decide, and it may be that several evenings will be necessary to make an equitable assessment. Several of the members of the Council have stated that final action would not be taken on the ordinance until the public were given an opportunity to become informed on the tax to be imposed upon the different professions and occupations.

C. W. SHERMAN DISCUSSES THE ROAD PETITION.

is almost complete as it now is; (4) the county has lately secured new and expensive road-building machinery—which Dairy precinct will have to help pay for—by which such work can be done better and cheaper than before, thereby lessening the cost of such work; and (5) labor and teams can be secured 20 per cent cheaper than they could when the road to Altamont was built, and, besides, the experience obtained in building the Altamont road ought to be worth quite a nest sum. Thus, it is seen, that the position taken by the board, as quoted in your article, that the improvement asked for would "take the entire road fund" is not supported by the facts. The statement was published some months ago in the Klamath Falls newspaper, as coming from Judge Griffith, that this county would spend \$20,000 this summer in the effort to make good roads to Lakewood. The generalizing of the Low Bill and the Flat would be of more benefit to the county, and make the road building responsibility not be put on the county. Why not build the road in this manner? The county has the word will, and it is original plans, which is to improve both roads as much as possible, at their disposal will be made. It is hoped that this will be done, but why appropriate \$500 for the road and not a cent for the Dairy road that all freighters have been using, are using and will continue to use, let the board do what it will. The phrase "both roads" is good, whether invented by village loafers or the brilliant imagination of the gifted Judge Griffith. It is to laugh.

The members of the county board are welcome to punish me all they like for my indignant protest, but when, by so doing, they lose sight of the public interest and do a public wrong, I submit that it is quite another matter, and a more serious one—for them. There are many other considerations I might submit, but I leave them for the future, if necessary, and subscribe myself,
