Said Engineer having filed his report with the Police Judge, and the same being satisfactory to the Council, notice is hereby given that at the regular meeting of the Common Council on Monday, the 7th day of June, 1909, an ordinance will be adopted embodying such report and within 60 days thereafter appraisers will be appointed to appraise the damages, if any, to the owner or owners of the following described parcel of real property, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of 9th street, which is N. 35 degrees 56 minutes E. 60 feet and N. 51 degrees 04 minutes W. 240 feet from the S. E. corner of Block 43, Nichols Addition. Thence N. 35 degrees 56 minutes E. 155.76 feet; thence N. 51 degrees 04 minutes W. 60 feet; thence S. 35 degrees 56 minutes W. 155.76 feet to the easterly line of said 9th street; thence along the easterly line of 9th street S. 51 degrees 04 minutes E. 60 feet to the place of beginning, required to be appropriated for such extension of said Canal street.
