Is there any reason to doubt that a good-natured hen might be induced to eat any kind of favoring matter that fastidious man might like in his omelette? Isn't it just possible that one of a convivial disposition might lay a species of ready-made eggnog that would find a ready market in our "dry" communities?

Or if hens could only be taught to love Easter-egg dyes—but perhaps it would be just as well not to confuse the humble fowl by starting too many things at once.
