**CHANGES IN LOCAL TRANSFER COMPANIES.**

One Company Buys Out the Other and a New Company Enters the Field.

Saturday saw kaleidoscopic changes in the ranks of the local transfer companies. The O. K. Transfer Company, the little giant that has grown until it practically controls all of the incoming and outgoing freight and baggage business of the city, purchased the equipment, goodwill and business of the Klamath Falls Forwarding Company, owned by Hunsaker & Stout. This was the strongest competitor the O. K. people have had, and the deal will undoubtedly prove satisfactory to both parties. Both companies have splendid horses and trucks. There is, perhaps, not another town on the coast of the same size as Klamath Falls that can claim the possession of a transfer company with equipment equal to that now owned by the O. K. Company.

No sooner was the news of the sale made public than there came the announcement of a new company—the People's Transfer Company. This company is fathered by E. L. Coburn, recently owner of the second stage line to Merrill, which he found to be an unprofitable venture, and formerly owner of the Klamath Falls and Winema Transfer Company, which concern was absorbed by the O. K. people at one stage of its career.

**UPPER LAKE NOTES.**

The first of the mosquito fleet will be launched at the Upper Landing today and will mark an agreeable epoch in our progression. The first, the "Ellen Gordon," is a small boat modeled and built for the accommodation of the people; something like the Odessa boats, only larger, carrying from five to ten people, and thoroughly safe. no means at hands nor time to test its depth. At one place the ice floor descends and presents the appearance of a river suddenly frozen in its fall to a lower level. The entire party of thirteen persons proved a lucky number in this case, for all descended the pine tree to this frigid chamber and bravely traversed its rugged floor without accident.

Captain O. C. Applegate, from whom we have received an account of this new discovery, tells us that his observations from the Black Cinder cone in the vicinity of these ice caves makes it evident that the cave system of which those mentioned form a part, extends from Merrill Butte to the great black ledge, the northern end of which forms Captain Jack's stronghold, a distance of about four miles, and that a double cave was perhaps continuing in former ages between these points. Many caves will no doubt be explored in the future in this region, not only historic on account of the warlike Modocs having made their last stand against the army of the United States here, but because it presents extraordinary scenic interest. It will surely become one of the greatest attractions in all the West, and will prove the Mecca of thousands and thousands of tourists in the years to come.
