MAD RUSH FOR LAND.

(Concluded From First Page.)
On timber claims the balance may be paid in four annual installments, five years being required to acquire full title to this class of property. Fourteen months are required on the agricultural lands, and the balance must be paid at the end of that period. A person's rights do not restrict them to make entry application in any certain one reservation. They are permitted to register for lands in all, and should they draw numbers entitling them to land in more than one they can take their choice between the reservations in which they have such choice.

Those receiving notice to make entry for lands in the Flathead district must present their applications to Kallanell for houses in the Kallanell district, and in Missoula for lands in the Missoula district. Persons holding numbers from 1 to 50 inclusive, must present their applications for making entry at the land office of the reservations in which they are allowed to make entry between the hours of 9 a. m. and 4:30 p. m., April 1, 1910. Those holding numbers 51 to 100, inclusive, must present them during the corresponding hours of the following day, and so on, until the lands are exhausted.

A trip from this county to any of the above places, including expenses, etc., can hardly be made short of \$100, even at the low reduced rates made possible by the Alaska-Yukon exposition, and we reiterate that this amount could not be placed to much better advantage here at home than by placing it on a 1,000-to-1 shot.
