Messrs. Parker and Taylor have taken the contract for moving 200,000 feet of lumber from Fort Klamath to this place.

Lumber for Captain Wickstrom's new barge arrived from Portland a few days ago and is being hauled from the depot to the lake to-day. We understand that the Eagle has the contract for moving a large quantity of wood from Crystal to Modoc point for the Southern Pacific company.

The mill had to shut down on Saturday, being out of logs. The Hooligan, however, will be in port with an immense raft before night.

The water front of the boat landing is being cleared of all kinds of obstructions, principally sunken logs, many of which were removed during the past week.

The steamer Hornet brought down two barges of sand from Modoc point on Saturday.

D. M. Griffith came down from Eagle point, his new resort, on Saturday. He talks of installing a wireless apparatus at his resort. If he does, one will be placed at St. Cloud and communication between Buena Vista heights and Eagle point is just possible in the near future.

### BROKERS' TECHNICALITIES

Long is when a person or party has a plentiful supply of stocks.  
A pool or ring is a combination formed to control the price of stocks.  
A bull is one who operates to raise the value of stocks that he may buy for a rise.  
Overloaded is when the bulls cannot take and pay for the stock they have purchased.  
A bear is one who sells stocks for future delivery which he does not own at the time of sale.  
A corner is when the bears cannot buy or borrow the stock to deliver in fulfillment of their contracts.  
A broker is said to carry stocks for his customers when he has bought and is holding it for his account.  
Short is when a person or party sells stocks when they have none and expect to buy or borrow in time to deliver.  
A wash is a pretended sale by special agreement between buyer and seller for the purpose of getting a quotation reported.  
A put and call is when a person gives so much per cent for the option of buying or selling so much stock on a certain fixed day at a price fixed the day the option is given.

### PIN FOR THE FAITHFUL

Although the new tariff bill has not been finally passed, there are several candidates for the positions created by the new law, says a recent dispatch from Washington. Col. Peter Hepburn, former member of congress from Iowa, wishes to be judge of the new customs court at a salary of \$7,000 a year. For the position of assistant attorney general to have charge of matters before the customs court, and which pays \$5,000 a year, there are two candidates. They are David C. Reeves of St. Joseph, Md., and William K. Payne of New York.

### HOW TO FIND YOURSELF.

Simple Directions for Getting on the Right Track When Lost in the Woods.

There are many ways of finding the cardinal points of the compass, north, south, east or west, when lost in the country. The bark of the pine, fir and other coniferous trees always is lighter in color, harder and drier on the south side and often is covered with mould and moss on the north side. The gum that oozes out from wounds and knot holes is usually hard and often of amber color on the south side while on the northern side it remains sticky longer and gets covered with insects and dirt. On large trees that have rough bark, especially during the autumn and winter, the nests and webs of insects, spiders, etc., will always be found in the crevices on the south side. More large branches will also be found on the warmest or southern side of the tree, and the needles are shorter, drier and of a yellowish-green on the southern side and longer, more pliable, damper and darker green on the north side. The ledges of rocks testify to the effect of light and shade. The sunny side will usually be bare, or at most only boast of a thin growth of dry mosses while the northern sides will be found damp and moldy and often covered with soft mosses and ferns.

### MAY RECALL NEW PENNIES

Initials of Designer May Cause Their Retirement.

A dispatch from Washington informs us that although the new Lincoln pennies have been out only since August 2, that they may be recalled. The reason is that the initials of the designer, Victor D. Brenner of New York, appear on the coin in minute raised letters. The initials are close to the edge on the reverse side below the sheaf of wheat, and can be seen with the naked eye. Coin collectors will be asked to rule upon it.

### BUST OF HILL UNVEILED.

Minneapolis day was celebrated at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition by the unveiling of a monument to James J. Hill, the great railroad builder, Governor John A. Johnson of Minnesota delivering the address. The bust is of large size, and is a fine likeness. The bronze rests on a granite base with blocks from Japan, Canada, Washington and Minnesota.
