SAYS HE ISN'T SICK

But Harriman Don't Feel Well and
Asks to Be Let Alone.

A recent dispatch from New York contains the following information concerning the health of the railroad magnate:

Mr. Harriman has dictated the following statement for the press:

"I am pursuing the course laid out before I went abroad, and advised by the physicians. I intended taking a rest as soon as my responsibilities would permit. My treatment abroad reduced my strength and vitality and weakened my digestion. The most expert physicians in Munich advised me to have an examination as a matter of precaution. This has been done very carefully by Drs. Brewer and Crile, in conjunction with Dr. Walter James and Dr. Lyle, but with the result that they found nothing serious, and renew the advice previously obtained that I should have rest and not see many people at any one time, and this I am trying to do.

"This covers the whole case, and later on, if the representatives of the press desire, and there is any purpose accomplished, I will see them up here, but now I ask that the surveillance of the operations of my home be withdrawn, not so much on account of my family or myself, but that the coming and going of my friends may not be interfered with. I appreciate the interest in my welfare by the press and friends in all sections, and perhaps by some others. If there was or should be anything serious, I will let the press know, and

as I have never deceived them I ask that the press now withdraw its representations and rely upon me."

FIRE THREATENS BIG TREES

A Yosemite, Cal., dispatch says: The troop of United States cavalry under the direction of Capt. Rush S. Wells, which has been fighting forest fires in this territory for several days, has stemmed the progress of the flames through persistent backfiring, and today the Sequoia groves in the national park are not in grave danger. Ten square miles of forest adjoining the park have been devastated, and the flames have crept into the reserve in several places near the Merced big tree grove. South of the Merced river a long sheet of flame is rolling slowly over the forest ridges in the direction of the Mariposa grove. The latter, however, is thirty miles distant from the conflagration, and in no immediate danger.
