list of between 1,000 and 1,500 of
the representative Republicans.

There is a difference of opinion,
however, how this representation
should be selected. This important
detail and the manner in which it
shall be worked out will be left in a
great measure to the party organiza-
tion in the several counties, although
an effort will first be made to con-
vince the party representatives in the
different counties that it will be ad-
vantageous to have uniform action in
each county.

Selection of delegates to the state
assembly by precinct elections does not
meet with the favor of a majority of
the men who are organizing the as-
sembly movement. On the contrary
they feel that the selection of such
delegates should be left to the differ-
ent county central committees for
the reason that these central commit-
tees constitute the duly legitimized au-
thority of the party in each county.

What is more, over the assembly
supporters, the members of the coun-
ty central committee were regularly
elected by the voters of the county at
a regular election. For that reason,
it is argued, that the central commit-
tees are directly representative of the peo-
ple of their respective communities
and are more qualified in every way
to represent their constituents when
it comes to determining the member-
ship of the state gathering.

"The course of Republicans who
are demanding an assembly will be
firm, vigorous and decisive," said a
prominent assembly advocate. "To
insure a successful assembly and the
nomination of the strongest possible
candidates for office, it will be neces-
sary that all personal ambitions be
buried in the interest of party reor-
ganization and the complete success
of the ticket which will be named. It
is in this direction that the assembly
forces are now proceeding. An earnest
effort is now being made to har-
monize our conflicting interest which
may prevail in the party, and secure
the hearty cooperation of all Republi-
cans that the party in state affairs
may duplicate the success which at-
tended the assembly held in Portland
for municipal purposes last spring.

"As a result, it will be the double
purpose of the proposed assembly to
revive the spirit which dogged under
the old conservative system and
also to restrict the abuses which have
developed through the operation of
the first primary law in the last ses-
sion. Who are right at the present
time is a question the party and the
people will decide. It is the purpose
of the assembly movement to re-
vitalize the party and to secure the
success of the party in the coming
elections."
