TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS

PORTLAND—The grand jury is confidently expected to indict the directors of the Oregon Trust and Savings bank.

SAN FRANCISCO—The Olympic Athletic club won the meet at the Portola last week.

NEW YORK—James J. Jeffries says he is just pining for a fight with Jack Johnson, and that he is nearly fit, but will be fitter.

PORTLAND—Mayor Simon has ordered the town cleared of gambling and disorderly houses. Bona fide boxing will be permitted.

PORTLAND—Trains are expected to run to Madras on the Deschutes by next June.

NEW YORK—P. H. McCarren, state senator and Democratic boss of Brooklyn, died October 23 without ever rallying from the effects of an operation for appendicitis on October 13th.

PARIS, Oct. 22—Count Boni de Castellane has asked the courts to force his former wife, Princess de Sagan, who was Miss Anna Gould, to send their children to school.

HOUSTON, Tex.—Ten acres of people gave Taft the most enthusiastic reception he has ever received in his travels through Texas.

ATLANTA, Ga.—Barney Oldfield in his Benz car made five miles in 3:52 2-5, beating his own record at Indianapolis by nearly 19 seconds.

PORTLAND—The missing ship Henrik Ibsen, which is overdue since last Saturday, is causing no little worry here.
