Orb Campbell, bookkeeper at the Klamath County Bank, has purchased the residence of B. E. Hayden, located east of the High School. It is stated that possession will be given June 1.

J. H. Hessig was in the city yesterday from Fort Klamath. Mr. Hessig is one of the leading merchants of the Fort and is also secretary of the Fort Klamath Telephone Company. He has established a telegraph connection with the telephone wire and is furnishing the happenings of Northern Klamath to the Evening Herald. This is the first strictly local telegraph system in operation in Klamath County, and enables the readers of this paper to get the news of the upper country while it is fresh.

An American company is equipping Rio Janeiro and the surrounding districts with a thoroughly modern telephone system.

The first process of making soda on an extensive scale was discovered by Nicholas Leblanc, a French chemist, in 1791.

Skimmed milk has been proved a valuable food for laying hens, according to experiments at the Virginia Experiment Station.

London has no grain elevators and never has had any, though it buys more wheat annually than any other city in the world.

Ohio produced 26,270,639 short tons of coal last year, a decrease from the previous year's output of about 18.27 per cent.

The Canadian Government supports more than a score of wireless telegraph stations along its coasts, five of which are on the Pacific.

Alaska has 4,000 miles of waterways navigable for steamers of which about 2,700 miles are included in the Yukon River and its tributaries.

The St. John's River in Florida is the only navigable river in the country that flows in a generally northerly direction into an ocean.

Iowa ships approximately 100,000,000 pounds of butter outside of its borders every year, the surplus product over and above the home consumption.

China's longest tunnel, a 7,000-foot bore on the line of the Kowloon-Canton Railway, recently was completed after more than two years of work.

The organisms to which the effects of vaccine are due still are unknown to scientists, being too small to be seen with the most powerful microscopes.

Statistics show a much greater per capita use of wheat flour in Germany and a corresponding decrease in the consumption of rye flour in recent years.

A bakery in Switzerland uses electricity to bake its bread, a baking surface of about thirty square feet handling about 900 pounds of bread every twelve hours.

Eastern astronomers claim that the solar eclipse of June 17 first was annular, then total, then annular again, the first occurrence of the kind recorded.

Bamboo Shoots as Food.

The bamboo shoots that are eaten are not yet branched, of a conical form and sheathed in an envelope generally covered by small, prickly bristles.

These young shoots emerge very vigorously from the soil at the foot of the bamboo tufts. The Chinese and Japanese, it appears, consume large quantities of them. They use them as seasoning with pork and chicken. The first thing in their preparation naturally is to rid the sprouts of their disagreeable sheath. They are then cut either lengthwise or in slices and are placed in boiling water. The water is renewed once or twice, and after adding salt a vegetable is obtained which reminds one strongly of the root of the artichoke. The Japanese also eat them preserved in brine or vinegar. The gathering of the young bamboo shoots, during which one must be careful of the prickly envelope, takes place in June and November in Tonkin. The November shoots are the better appreciated.—New York Herald's Paris Edition.

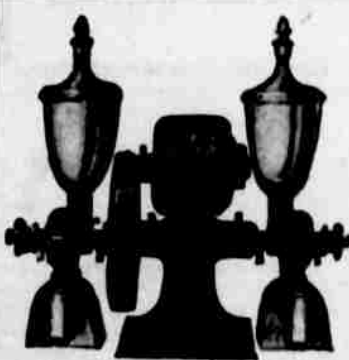
