### NORTHERN PACIFIC TO EXPLOIT STATE

Railroad Will Put Force of Publicity Men to Work in Oregon Within Thirty Days

Within the next thirty days the Northern Pacific Railway company will put a force of trained writers and publicity men in the field preparatory to conducting an extensive advertising campaign that will be Oregon statewide in its scope. This announcement was made yesterday by A. D. Charlton, assistant passenger agent of the railroad. The advertising campaign is incidental to the large extension of Northern Pacific interests in Oregon, which began last fall when the Oregon Trunk railway began building up the Deschutes canyon to Central Oregon. It is now definitely known that the Northern Pacific is an equal partner with the Great Northern in the invasion of what has heretofore been exclusively Harriman territory. Howard Elliott, president of the Northern Pacific, made this known first in Portland at the time of his visit here with James J. Hill somewhat over a month ago.

Since then it has become known that the Northern Pacific is interested equally with the Great Northern in the purchase and extension of the Oregon Electric, United Railways and Pacific & Eastern.

The two railway systems are now engaged in construction work or are about to enter into contracts for extensions in Oregon, the aggregate in cost of which will be close to \$10,000,000. This includes the 150 miles of Oregon Trunk railway under construction from Sello to Bend, the twenty-four miles of United Railways line now building toward Tillamook, the two miles of Mount Cavalry line of the United Railways under way, the extension of the Pacific & Eastern across the Cascades to connect Medford with the Oregon Trunk line also in progress of construction; the contract for the construction of the remaining 50 miles of the Tillamook line of the United Railways soon to be

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### KEY TO CORK LEG BETRAYS SWINDLER

Man Who Duped Banks in Many Cities Captured in Seattle

 After a spectacular swindling career along lines identical with those of J. Rufus Wallingford of summer fiction, Thaddeus E. York was run to earth in Seattle yesterday because he wanted to take a bath, and to do so he had to unlock his cork leg. York, under the alias of Frank B. Houston, swindled the American Bank and Trust company of Klamath Falls of \$5,500, where he played the Wallingford role to perfection, and then he came to Portland and under the name of J. A. Ross he swindled a local bank out of \$2,500, which sum he promptly invested in Portland real estate.

York is considered one of the cleverest swindlers in the country, and for the past year the Pinkertons have been on his trail. He has buccined big concerns for many thousands of dollars, and bought tracts of land in Oregon and Washington, buying outright an entire township in Washington. His operations have extended over the Pacific Coast and in the south, and but for the fact that he wanted to take a bath, York might today be a free man.

York had a cork leg. While in San Francisco he had a new leg made, for which he deposited \$50, when the price was \$150. Thus York beat the cork leg manufacturer out of \$100 until one day, when he wanted to bathe and to do so must remove the leg, he lost the key. York sent to the maker for a duplicate key, accompanying it with the \$100 he had neglected to pay originally. The lost key was found by the Pinkertons, and with this bit of metal as a clue the detectives traced the swindler finally to the steamer President when it left San Francisco for Seattle. P. K. Ahern, of the Pinkerton Bank & Bankers' Association, was advised by telegraph, and with the sheriff of King county caused York's arrest when he stepped ashore yesterday. Henry E. Von Groenewald, in charge of the Pinkerton office in Port-

land, had been searching for York for the trick he turned on a local bank a few weeks ago, under the name of Ross. Von Groenewald says that York is an ex-convict, who was a telegraph operator. The swindler secured 57 blanks of the Northern Express Company's money orders, and by means of these secured \$10,000 in coin. Last year he trimmed James Stone, of Chicago, for \$900. In Kentucky he operated extensively, and touched the State Bank of Chicago for \$5,000. Last April he swindled the American Bank & Trust Company of Klamath Falls for \$5,500, and then came to Portland, cleaned up \$2,500, and going to Seattle, swindled the American Savings & Trust Company for \$1,339. In May he swindled a Bellingham bank for \$2,300.

Representing himself as Frank B. Houston, York visited the Klamath Falls Investment Company at San Francisco and said he had a large amount of money to invest. He was recommended to go to Klamath Falls, which he did, and there he rivalled Wallingford. As Houston, York en-
