**NORTHERN PACIFIC TO EXPLOIT STATE**

(Continued from Page 1)  
let, and the bridge spanning of the  
Columbia at Celilo, which alone will  
cost \$1,500,000.

The Northern Pacific's part in these  
enterprises is represented in round  
numbers by about \$5,000,000, and it  
is also now engaged in double-track-  
ing its own line between Portland and  
Tacoma at an expense of \$5,000,000  
more. The latter work will cause a  
further accumulation of benefits to  
Portland and Oregon and facilitate  
the handling of traffic received from  
the feeders built in co-operation with  
the Great Northern into Oregon. In  
all the Northern Pacific is spending  
nearly \$10,000,000 within a radius of  
150 miles of Portland.

The Northern Pacific is now to back  
up this construction work with a cam-  
paign to attract investors and home-  
seekers to the State of Oregon. The  
men who will have charge of the work  
of gathering material for exhibi-  
tion and writing booklets descrip-  
tive of the country will constitute a  
large staff. Included in the party will  
be L. J. Bricker, general immigration  
agent, who will be assisted in the di-  
rection of the work by Development  
Agent Willard and A. Decker, special  
representative of the publicity de-  
partment of the company. There will  
also be several staff writers and pho-  
tographers who will cover all of in-  
terior Oregon, the Tillamook country  
and the Willamette valley.

Materials for advance literature  
have already been accumulated by Mr.  
Charlton's office force and forwarded  
to the publicity department. Specimens  
of fruit, grains, grasses, vegeta-  
bles and farm products in general  
are to be secured and displayed in a  
special car equipped to advertise Oregon  
throughout the East.

While it is the plan that Oregon  
will have a car devoted to exhibits  
from this state alone, the exploitation  
work, undertaken by the representa-  
tives of the road while in the West, it  
is understood, will include parts of  
Washington. Mr. Decker is now in  
Eastern Washington and has also vis-  
ited the southwestern part of that  
state.

tortained royally, gave joy rides and  
looked over Klamath Falls. He said  
he thought the place needed a hotel  
and he would build a \$100,000 es-  
tablishment. He let contracts for a  
\$20,000 hotel, saying it would be  
enlarged as business warranted.

With the American Bank & Trust  
Company, he deposited a cashier's  
check on the First National Bank of  
Lexington, Ky., for \$19,860. He had  
similar phoney checks for \$30,000  
and \$40,000. Later he drew out  
\$5,325, and a short time afterward  
an additional \$2,000.

Having established himself as a  
promoter, a good fellow and high  
liver, York bought \$558.25 worth of  
jewelry from H. J. Winters, the Klamath  
Falls jeweler, and gave a worth-  
less check in payment. This jeweler,  
explained York, was presented to  
various people in Klamath Falls as a  
token of his esteem and regard. J.  
Rufus Wallingford could not have  
worked the game on a larger scale  
nor made a better impression. Then  
he departed.

Portland was his next stop, and as  
J. A. Ross he perpetrated one swindle,  
after which he skipped, with Von  
Groenewald on his trail. Back and  
forth along the coast York fitted un-  
til caught. He went to Tonopah, Nev.,  
and loafed around the poolrooms.  
Having been a telegraph operator, he  
read the messages on races coming  
over the wire, and with this knowl-  
edge he stung the poolrooms. This  
he considered such a good joke that  
he confided it to a business man at  
Klamath Falls.

The Tonopah adventure occurred  
before he had the duplicate key to his  
leg sent to Pasco, Wash. York be-  
lieved in the West, and for this rea-  
son a great deal of the money he se-  
cured by swindles he invested in real  
estate. He has property in Portland  
and several places in Oregon. Wash-  
ington, too, attracted him and he in-  
vested in the Pine Tree State freely.

Sotherland, George W. Hampton,  
Frank B. Houston and J. A. Ross.
