TALANTED MUSICIANS WILL BE HERE

PASMORE TRIO A DELIGHT TO MUSIC LOVERS

Are Artists on Their Instruments and Hold Their Audiences Spell-Bound

It is a pleasure to record the artistic accomplishments and brilliant career of the Pasmore trio who, in a comparatively short time, have gained a truly enviable position among the leading artists of the day. Gifted with charm of personality and magnetic powers of no small degree, the possessors of genius polished by years of study in this country and on the continent, the Pasmore are, musically and intellectually, a delight to all who hear them. Wherever they have played press, critics and public alike have praised them. While in Europe they gave thirty-four concerts in Berlin alone—an achievement never before accomplished by any group of American artists. Elsewhere is told how the German capital received them. Laudatory as those criticisms are, they are inadequate, for cold type cannot cope with their golden notes. To appreciate their art one must hear them. As an eminent critic has tersely said: "They just play."

And when they play the whole soul of each performer goes into her finger tips. Versatile to a degree, the trio gives numbers that range from the homely melody of "The Old Folks at Home" to the famous Tchaikowsky trio in all its dramatic intensity. In the solo work, which forms a large portion of the programs, exquisite piano numbers follow the sobbing songs of the "cello. Then comes the violin solos, and the ensemble selections in which all artists take part. From beginning to end the auditor is held by that spell which only the master performer can cast. For, whether they play alone or in unison, the Pasmore bring to their aid that delicate refinement, delightful expression and musical understanding that must always impress those who reverse that noblest form of all expression—music.
