BETTER ROADS IN OREGON SOUGHT

THE NEW ASSOCIATION TO PROMOTE MOVEMENT TO SECURE THEM IS FORMED—ORGANIZATION TEMPORARY.

PORTLAND, May 1.—The Oregon Association for Highway Improvement is the name of the organization that has been formed to take the place of the Oregon Good Roads Association. The officers of the new association are: President, Carlos T. Prall; vice-president, James D. Cole; treasurer, Dr. Andrew C. Smith; secretary, W. L. Priest. The board of directors includes the president, vice-president and treasurer and Phil S. Bates and Amos Moore.

The association will hold a special meeting on May 15 and will at that time complete its organization.

Communications were received from various commercial clubs throughout the state endorsing the plans of the new association. It is planned to organize a branch association in each county in the state and to invite automobile clubs and similar organizations to become affiliated with the state association as well as an effective good roads campaign can be started. The railroad companies operating in this state have signified a desire to assist the association in every way possible.
