LONDON, May 2.—"Give us a drink, bartender. Then give us the 'ack fare 'ome."  
This will be the final request of all "jags" in English "pubs" hereafter if a plan fathered by prominent temperance workers of England, which is said to have ended drunkenness in Copenhagen, is put into legal effect.  
Under the Danish law the saloon-keeper who sells the last drink to an intoxicated person is required to pay the latter's cab fare home.  
In Copenhagen, it is said, the drunkards are strong for the law, but the saloonkeeper who has once been "stung" rarely gets bit twice in the same place. The result is that though beer and akavit—a sort of gin—are cheaper in Copenhagen than almost anywhere else in the world today, a drunkard is rarely seen in the Danish capital.

FREEWATER, May 2.—The artesian well of the commercial orchards of J. H. Hall is being rushed by both day and night shifts. The bore is now 750 feet, and Contractor Durant states that in order to secure the flow it will probably be necessary to go fully 1,000 feet, 300 feet deeper than any other well drilled in the Walla Walla Valley.  
The formation is about the same as in the rest of the country, but in the case of the other wells bedrock was reached at a depth of about 500 feet.
