"Mutt and Jeff some day in the future may be regarded as a classic," said Professor Barrett Wendell, head of the department of English at Cambridge since 1880 in a recent speech. "The adventures of the genial Mr. Mutt and the credulous Mr. Jeff have furnished delight for many a humorous portrayal of certain aspects of contemporary life. WAR VETERANS ARE LAST TO WANT FORT GROUNDS

WALLA WALLA, Wash., May 22.—Veterans of the Spanish American war will ask the United States government for the grounds of Fort Walla Walla for the purpose of establishing there a home for all old and disabled volunteer soldiers of any war. There are at present several plans for disposal of the fort grounds, among which stands pre-eminent the one of selling it at auction to the highest bidder, and only to such people as observe homestead rules in living on the land and cultivating it. The strife for possession of the fort grounds has been exceedingly bitter, and final disposition will be welcomed, whatever it is.

MILL RUNS SAWDUST INTO A STREAM AND IS FINED \$50

McMINNVILLE, May 22.—J. F. Cole of Fairvale was recently arraigned here in a justice court upon a complaint filed against him by Deputy Game Warden O. B. Parker, charging him with running sawdust into a stream. He pleaded guilty and was fined \$50 and costs. He is the second person this spring to pay a fine for violating the game law in this manner.

MARRIAGES LEGAL, EVEN IF PASTOR BREAKS LAW

SALEM, May 22.—In response to a question asked by anxious lovers whether a marriage ceremony performed by a minister or a priest who may not have filed with the county clerk his statement of authority as provided in the new law would be legal, Attorney General Crawford gave an off-hand opinion that these marriages would not be illegal, although the minister or priest so performing the ceremony would be subject to fine.

"Marriage is a civil contract," said the attorney general, "but for the protection of the morals of society, the state evidence of entrance into that contract must be furnished. Therefore certain parties are empowered to bind the contract. The failure of a minister to file his statement of authority would be a crime on his part, but would not invalidate a marriage contract, provided he actually had the proper authority."

REINTERMENT OF 8,000 CHINESE IS PROPOSED

SAN FRANCISCO, May 22.—The validity of the law requiring the payment of a \$10 fee before a body can be exhumed from its grave was attacked today by the Chinese Six Companies, when permission was asked to remove the 8,000 Chinese interred in the old Chinese cemetery at San Mateo.

It is the desire of the Six Companies to exhume the bodies of the 8,000 Chinese and ship the remains to China for reinterment. But the Chinese refuse to pay the \$10 per body, or \$80,000 for the 8,000. Through their attorneys they allege the old law requiring the fee has been vitiated by later legislation.

The Six Companies will now bring a test case and carry it through to the supreme court, if necessary.

The French government has modified the legal time in that country so as to bring it within the same standard time zone as England, Belgium, Holland and Spain.
