**DESIRE FOR THEFT CURED BY SURGEON**

BERKELEY, May 26.—Mrs. Jean Thuraber, 26 years old, who, according to her physicians, has been cured of criminal tendencies by the surgeon's knife, will be released from a grand larceny charge Monday by Justice of the Peace Robert Edgar.

Following repeated arrests for petty thefts in various bay cities Mrs. Thuraber served a year's sentence in the penitentiary, and on her release from San Quentin in July, 1910, was placed under the care of the probation department in San Francisco. Six months later she was arrested on a charge of stealing jewelry. Her case was called to the attention of Dr. H. N. Rowell of this city, and she was operated upon. Dr. Rowell announced that the woman is cured.
