# COSMOPOLITAN AS TO FRESHMEN

NEW STUDENTS FROM JAPAN, RUSSIA, CHINA, HAWAII AND CANADA COME TO OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE

CORVALLIS, Oct. 6.—Five foreign countries, Japan, Russia, China, Hawaii and Canada, are represented in the big crowd of new students who enrolled at the Oregon Agricultural college during the first week. The records of the registrar's office showed 840, as compared with 678 at the end of the first week last year, though the clerical force has been too busy to catalogue more than half of the students. It has already been found that more than eleven states have sent entries.

From the east coast come New York, Massachusetts, New Jersey and Connecticut students; from the Middle West boys and girls of Kentucky, Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin; from every other Northwestern state others are added, and a large delegation from Los Angeles and vicinity will swell the rolls of the Southern California Club.

Special research work is being done by graduates and former students of the University of Minnesota, University of Illinois, Iowa State college, and the University of California. A gain of 20 per cent is shown in the registration in forestry, and a still further growth is expected when all the advanced students are registered. A 10 per cent increase in the domestic science department, 34 per cent in the commerce school, and 20 per cent in the horticultural division are also shown.
