SCOTCH CHIEFS INTER HATCHET

THREE HUNDRED YEARS OF STRIFE AMONG CLAN HEADS SETTLED BY AGREEMENT TO ABIDE BY COIN TONS

GLASGOW, Scotland, Oct. 7.—The Clan Macdonald has buried the hatchet. After 300 years of strife among the three factions of the clan, the leaders have signed a treaty of peace. The chief of Glengarry, the chief of Biant and the chief of Glanranald were brought together by Sir Alexander Macdonald at a meeting of the general clan.

Each had strenuously contended for the honors of supreme chieftainship. Sir Alexander proposed the simple expedient of tossing a coin.

This was accepted, with the proviso that the coin be tossed on each occasion when there should be a clash as to precedence, the winner to be the chieftain for that particular day.
