GABRIEL'S PATRIOTISM SUFFERS A RELAPSE

Italian Poet, Who Forsook His Sunny Native Land For Columbia's Shores, Prints a Long Poem Landing His Birth Heath

 PARIS, Nov. 8.—Gabriel d'Annunzio, the Italian poet, who has forsaken his native land to live here, has had a relapse of patriotism. He has just published in a Milan newspaper a poem of forty-four verses singing the praises of Tripoli. It is called "Hym to the Land Over the Sea."

DANGER BY WIRELESS IS LATEST FOR SHIPS AT SEA

Proximity of Bad Spots on Brittany Coast Miles Off Will Be Flashed From New-Style Lighthouse for Benefit of Navigators

 PARIS, Nov. 8.—Ships carrying wireless will be warned off danger spots on the Brittany coast while miles away by "the wireless warner," the latest thing in lighthouses. Automatically the musical notes of "do" and "sol" will be sent forth at intervals of ten seconds, each being reproduced three times. At Quessant the French government is building a lighthouse of 3,000 candle power, visible twenty-one miles at sea. A "radio lighthouse" stands adjoining.

CHINESE SEND MORE HOME THAN OTHER FOREIGNERS

Average of Those in New York Who Remit Money to Families in Celestial Empire Is Thousand Dollars a Year

 NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—The Chinese lead all nations represented in New York in the matter of sending money to their families across the sea. Statistics show that an average of \$1,000 a year each is sent to China by Celestials living here.

The Japanese send home barely a third of that sum per capita. The Italians send more money out of this country than any other nationality, but they send only about half as much per capita as the Chinese.
