VIENNA, Nov. 14.—Archduke Ferdinand Carl of Austria renounces his dual crown, title, rank and many orders early in December to make pretty little Fraulein Rosa Czauber, daughter of a professor in the technical high school, his wife.
Emperor Franz Joseph has finally consented to the archduke's renunciation and his marriage.
For five years the archduke has been attempting to secure the royal pleasure to a ceremony that will legalize and legitimize the wife who has borne him two beautiful children, and for whom he has given up all.
It is understood that the emperor has not only consented to it, but will give the archduke 40,000 crowns a year.
