BANK FOR PAISLEY SOON TO BE DOING BUSINESS

Institution Badly Needed—Will Be Headed by Oklahoma Man, and Other Financial Institutions Will Be Stockholders

LAKEVIEW, Nov. 17.—Paisley is to have a bank. The new institution will be headed by President Van Winkle, a former Oklahoma man, and among others that will have stock in the affair will be: The Northwest Townsite company, First National of Bend and the Deschutes Savings bank, all solid institutions that show their faith in this part of the country by taking an interest in its welfare and investing money here. The long distance of Paisley from the south end of the county and the time taken in transacting banking matters have caused the need of a bank. It will cater to a part of the state as large as some Eastern states, extending from Paisley to Bend, and at far east as parts of Harney county.

PLAT ORCHARD TRACTS OF LAND NEWLY BOUGHT

Seager Brothers Buy Quarter Section From Charles Easton, Who Intends to Establish a Freight Truck Service When Railroad is Completed

LAKEVIEW, Nov. 17.—A 150-acre ranch belonging to a 320 owned by Rancher Charles Easton, near Sugar Loaf mountain, was sold to Seager Brothers a few days ago, and the purchasers will plat the same into orchard tracts.

Easton takes a Lakeview residence owned by Claude R. Seager as part payment, and is going to establish a trucking line from the N.-C.-O. railway depot to the business part of town as soon as the new line is completed to this point. He has ordered heavy freighting trucks for the service.

The Seagers are transferring all their interests to the Davis Creek section of Goose Lake Valley, where they have thousands of acres of fruit lands under their care.
