### WEST TABOOS HANGING, WILL HAVE NONE OF IT

Before Going East He Commutes the Hanging of Hanging to Life Term and Announces His Intention to Suspend Law of the State

SALEM, Nov. 29.—As long as Governor Oswald West is chief executive of the state of Oregon, no person convicted of first degree murder will be hanged as a penalty for the crime.

Governor West made this formal statement just before he took his departure for the East as he commuted the sentence of Jans William Hanging, the Portland wife murderer, to life imprisonment.

He says the old rule that blood must be expiated by the shedding of blood is a relic of barbarism, and not in keeping with the civilization of the twentieth century.

### MASSACRE OF FOREIGNERS THREATENED AT HANYANG

PEKIN, Nov. 28.—A slaughter of foreigners as well as Chinese is threatened at Hanyang, where imperialists are looting and killing.

The situation is regarded as more critical than any time since the Boxer uprising.

Foreigners have barricaded the streets leading to their concessions with mounted Maxim guns preparing desperately to resist an anti-foreign outbreak.
