GETS LETTER FROM POPE

She is 75 Years Old, and Celebrating Golden Jubilee of Accident Which Resulted in Total Paralysis of Her Muscular System

MILAN, Dec. 2.—Pope Pius X has addressed an autograph letter to an aged Swiss nun, Sister Frey, who, during half a century of cloistered life in the Cistercian abbey at Viterbo, has enjoyed an extraordinary reputation as a clairvoyant. Sister Frey, who is 75 years old, is celebrating the golden jubilee of an accident occurring in 1861, which resulted in total paralysis in consequence of which she has been bedridden. She is unable to move. Sister Frey is credited with a gift of prophecy and second sight. For many years she has been sought by cardinals, bishops and persons of noble birth. They visit her in her convent cell, where by special dispensation of the pope mass is allowed to be celebrated. She is said to have predicted to Pius X many things concerning the events of his pontificate, and to have narrated, while in a trance and in the presence of the assembled sisters, the events in detail of the assassination of President Carnot; and, more recently, of King Humbolt, while those tragedies were actually taking place. The pope has chosen Cardinal Casazza to deliver the autograph letter, in which he praises her Christian resignation and regrets his inability to make in person the pilgrimage to Viterbo.
