### MAN OF MYSTERY TO HAVE IDENTITY PROBED

Insurance Company Fights Payment of Big Policy on Ground That Geo. A. Kimmel Is Alive in the Person of Andrew J. White

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 7.—The celebrated case of George A. Kimmel, "the man of mystery," is to have an airing in the courts again this week.

In the federal court here suit was brought by Kimmel's heirs and other interested parties to recover the amount of a policy held by the missing man in the New York Life Insurance company. This will be the second trial of the case.

In the first trial the jury disagreed, being unable to determine to their own satisfaction whether Kimmel was dead or alive. Since the first trial there have been some new and interesting developments, and it is believed that the present trial may solve the mystery that has puzzled the people of half a dozen states for nearly fifteen years.

The Kimmel case is among the most singular in this country, involving the identity of a man supposed to be dead. George A. Kimmel was born in Niles, Mich. in 1867. After receiving his education in the public schools he entered the employ of his uncle, Charles A. Johnson, as a bank clerk. Later he engaged in real estate and investments in Omaha, and still later he became cashier of the Farmers' State bank at Arkansas City, Kans. He was president of various corporations which owed money to his uncle's bank and other banking institutions.

In July, 1898, while cashier at Arkansas City, Kimmel went to Topeka to have some bonds redeemed. From Topeka he went to Kansas City. Realizing he could not reach Kansas City before the close of banking hours, he telephoned to his bank correspondent to have \$530.20 brought over to the Midland hotel. He arrived at the hotel and the cashier handed him the currency. Immediately after he left the hotel, and from that hour he has never been seen alive, according to the declaration of his relatives and intimate acquaintances.

The Kimmel family attempted to collect insurance after the seven-year period, after which a missing man is supposed to be dead. Kimmel, three

months before his disappearance, had taken out insurance to the value of about \$25,000. At the time of his disappearance, according to evidence introduced at the first trial of the insurance, Kimmel owed nearly \$45,000, which has since been made good. In the meantime the insurance company discovered a man in the asylum for the criminal insane at Matteawan, N. Y., who claimed to be Kimmel. He bore the name of Andrew J. White. In the course of interviews the man gave a number of startling facts about himself purporting to prove that he was Kimmel. According to his original story he had been assaulted by footpads in Kansas City, and the attack had left him mentally irresponsible and for a long time he was unaware of his identity. While in this condition, he declared, he had committed crimes which led to his imprisonment.
