WESTERN FEDERAL PROBE TO BEGIN IN CALIFORNIA

Among Features to be Investigated Are Violation of Law by Carrying Dynamite on Trains and Misuse of the Mails

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 7.—California's end of the federal probe into the McNamara case will begin here within a few days.

The department of justice at Washington has instructed the federal grand jury here to take up the entire case.

Tentative plans for the investigation were arranged following conferences between Assistant District Attorney Regan and County District Attorney Fredericks.

Fredericks has admitted that the investigation is about ready to commence. In addition to the probe of the violation of the interstate commerce act by the McNamaras and their lieutenants in transporting dynamite through the mails there will also be an investigation of alleged misuse of the mails by the McNamara defense.

STACY ALASKA CLAIMS ARE DECLARED ILLEGAL

Supreme Court Decision, Wickersham Asserts, Opens Way to Prosecution of All Coal Land Frauds in That Territory

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 7.—The supreme court of the United States has declared the so-called Stacy group of Alaska coal claims, valued at \$10,000,000, illegal. The case was first decided against the government by Judge Hanford of Seattle.

Charles Munday and Arch Shields obtained their claims through dummies, the government charged.

Attorney General Wickersham declares the supreme court decision opens to prosecution all the Alaska coal frauds, and says:

"We are greatly pleased. The case was first decided against us by Judge Hanford when the atmosphere of Seattle was more friendly to the development of Alaska than to a due respect for the mining laws."
