Supreme Court Decision, Wickershan Asserts, Opens Way to Prosecution of All Coal Land Frauds in That Territory

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 7 .-The supreme court of the United States has declared the so-called Staeey group of Alaska coal claims val had by applying to Edson Watson, und at \$10,000,000, illegal. The case was first decided against the govern ment by Judge Hanford of Scattle.

Charles Munday and Arch Shields btained their claims through dummies, the government charged.

Attorney General Wickersham de clares the supreme court decision opens to prosecution all the Alaska coal frauds, and says:
