

## FOR NEW LIBRARY PETITION IS OUT

COUNTY COURT WILL BE ASKED TO LEVY SPECIAL TAX FOR MAINTENANCE — CARNEGIE MAY GIVE BUILDING

A petition is being circulated in this city by the Women's Library Club, to have the county court levy an additional tax of one-half mill on all the assessed property in the county, for purpose of maintaining a new library when one may be built. The proposed tax would yield \$7,500 per year, and is aimed to be imposed under a new state law which permits it to be levied for the purpose indicated.

The club has been in communication with Andrew Carnegie, who gives library buildings on condition that the recipients assure maintenance of the institutions, and believe that his attitude is an encouraging one. It is hoped to get a \$20,000 building.

## G. O. P. CONVENTION WILL BE HELD IN WINDY CITY

National Republican Committee Picks June 18th Next as Date for Beginning of the Struggle for the Presidential Nomination

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 12.—The republican national committee decided that the convention should be held at Chicago, opening on June 15, next year. With the Hilles-Hitchcock fight over now on, the Taftites are confronted by the greatest crisis in Taft's campaign for re-election. Taftites and La Folletteites have both sought to discount the Roosevelt boom.

The committee by a rising vote, accepted Hitchcock's resignation and elected ex-Governor Hill of Maine to fill the unexpired term. The executive committee then announced the new personnel of the arrangements committee.

The following sub-committee on call of convention was named: Borah of Idaho, William Ward of New York, Capers of South Carolina, Lowder of Illinois, Rosewater of Nebraska. A committee to arrange for a presidential primary in the District of Columbia was named.

By an overwhelming vote the committee defeated the presidential primary, only seven members supporting Borah, who forced the issue, and 44 voting nay.

## CONTINUANCE IS CARROLL'S PLEA

Motion for continuance of the trial of Carroll vs. Cantrill made by C. M. O'Neill for the defendant, was up today before Judge Percy R. Kelly in circuit court. Attorney Charles F. Stone for the plaintiff intimated that the motion was not made in good faith, which caused Attorney O'Neill to say that the intimation was as false as anything which ever dropped from the lip of man. He said nothing about woman.

Mr. O'Neill argued that he was suffering from chronic throat affliction and that Dr. Parker had examined him only this morning. He was unable to say when he could go on with the trial and unable to make a sworn statement, as desired by the plaintiff side, on this point. He said that the motion was made purely owing to his own disability, and not on any basis furnished by his client nor because the client had not been willing to hustle around and get his witnesses together.

Judge Kelly said that the burden of knowing that a continuance would be asked for rested with the defendant at the time the case was set for trial, and that the plaintiff was entitled to costs and disbursements attendant upon making preparation to go ahead with the case at this time. If the defendant wanted to meet these items and defray them, the case would be continued, otherwise the court would go ahead with the case at 1 p. m.

Falling this, Judge Kelly said very plainly that motion for a non-suit would be entertained.

When the case came up at 1 p. m. attorneys filed affidavits of expenses totaling \$635, to which the defense determined to file counter affidavits. The court allowed time for the preparation of the latter papers, so that the case was put over until later in the day.

## LAUNDRY PIPE HAS PRIOR RIGHT

HOT WATER CONDUIT IS IN ROAD OF FOURTH SEWER UNIT, BUT WAS THERE FIRST, SO CITY PLAYS SECOND FIDDLE

E. C. Meyers, inspector for the fourth sewer unit, reported to the council last night that the Klamath Falls steam laundry has a pipe conveying hot water to its plant which is in the way of the proposed sewer, and that D. R. Campbell, who owns the laundry, stated that the pipe had been there for six years and would remain there for some time in the future.

City Attorney Horace M. Manning agreed, in a sense, with Mr. Campbell, stating that the laundry people had a prior right as against the city, and that the city, if it changed the position of the pipe to accommodate the sewer, would have to do so at its own expense. The inspector was authorized to have the work done at the expense of the city. Mayor Fred T. Sanderson said it would not cost more than \$2.50, and that he would do the digging himself for that. The council laughed at the low estimate of his honor. Meyers said it would cost considerable over \$2.50.

## COUNTY SCHOOLS ARE PROGRESSIVE

have voted a strong special tax in order to lengthen the term to eight months. There are a number of new families in this district, and the school is fuller than it has been for a number of years.

On Thursday the school at Shasta View was visited. This is in the new Bohemian colony, and progress is in the air, in school matters as well as agriculturally. These people want the best they can get in the way of schools, and are willing to tax themselves for it. They have voted a special tax to pay interest on bonds for the school house, which will amount to 13 mills. They are making good use of the money. Here will be found a modern, well equipped two-room school building. The building is well furnished, the floor is kept well oiled and the janitor work is well done. A meeting of the board convened with the superintendent, and all the suggestions he made for the improvement of school conditions were acted upon and will be attended to promptly. B. P. Alexander, a prominent teacher of Klamath county, is principal and Miss Helebeck is assistant. Both teachers are normal graduates, and are working hard for the advancement of the school.

Mr. Swan spent Friday and Saturday in Malin, visiting the school and attending a school meeting. The growth here has been so rapid, that although a new school house was completed this summer at a cost of \$2,000 the building is already overcrowded, and more room and another teacher are badly needed. The school meeting was held for the purpose of taking measure to meet this condition. The meeting was well attended. All expressed a willingness to employ another teacher and keep the school up to the highest standard of efficiency possible.

It was decided to take steps to build another room and employ another teacher. A 5 mill tax was voted to meet the expense of a second teacher for the balance of the year, and a bond election meeting will be called as soon as possible to vote a bond issue to finance the building. The only dissatisfaction expressed in regard to school affairs in this district was in regard to the contractor's work on the new school building. Much trouble was experienced in getting the work done according to specifications, and a number of defects are noticeable in the workmanship. It would seem that if a contractor has any regard for his work it would be made manifest on a public school building.

In this district two years ago there were scarcely enough children to maintain the district, now there are 75 enumerated, and several families have bought land and will be there in the Spring. The Bohemian colony will mean much in the development of Klamath county. They are indefatigable workers, and the results of the year's work are apparent on every hand. Many of them are building comfortable and substantial residences and outbuildings. They have

much of their land already cleared, and report excellent crops this year. They have started a move to secure a sugar beet factory, and also hope to have a creamery as soon as they can raise enough cows to provide it with cream.

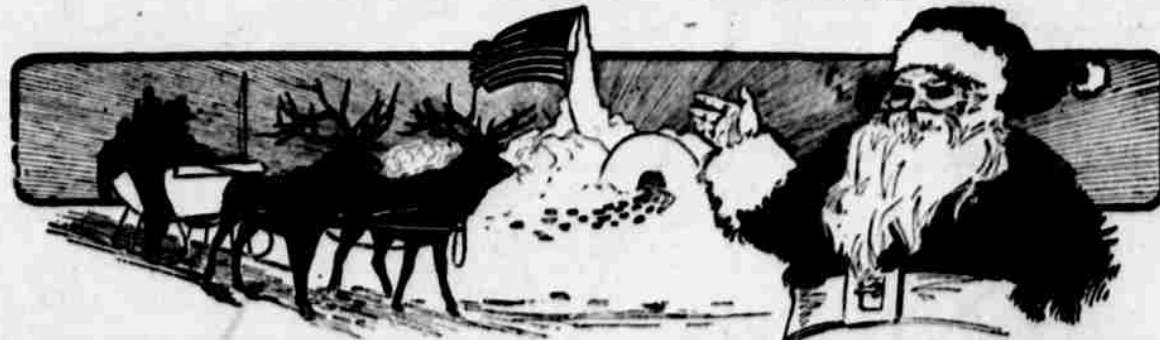
