Socialism

The paramount remedy prescribed by socialists to righten our economical and social wrongs is that we receive the natural resources which have been monopolized, and also the manufacturing and transportation facilities that have been monopolized, and arrange them on a collective ownership basis, so they will benefit the whole people, instead of only a few.

Consequently, in order to be a good socialist, it is necessary to always propagate and vote for collective ownership of such things whenever there is a chance to do so.

But there are many other ways to act that may even retard the condition we are striving to obtain. To my mind there are a few who retard the coming of the system that will make it possible for everybody that deserves it to reap his or her share of benefit from the natural resources as much as those who everlastingly balk against all kinds of development which has capital behind it. It matters not how much we despise the capitalist system the only safe, sane and sober way for us to act is to use it for all it is worth until we get ready to put a better system on—the sooner we can wear it out the sooner will we get a better one.

We ought to be shrewd, and attack the forte of least resistance—we ought to drive our wedges and apply our lever that we make the bowlder tip by its own weight and roll off our road. We must let the perverted will of the human mind that won't be allayed burn itself out with as brisk and bright a blaze as possible, and quit our futile attempts to smother it with wet blankets.

Mother Nature has a wonderful supply of everything needed for our welfare, but it takes a great deal of labor on our part to open up her storehouse, and as long as we refuse to do that labor except under the control of capitalism, just so long is capitalism needed.

Therefore I have resolved to not try and put any barrier against any kind of development that is needed to make nature yield of her bounty to human need, even though I know that capitalism inaugurate hardship for the masses, as I can clearly see that such hardship will spur the people onward to emancipate themselves from the tyranny of capitalism.

Capitalism must yield to the concentrated will of the people as soon as the people learn how to demand their rights. But simply to balk against development on account of our grudge against capitalism, and then ourselves refuse to tackle the tasks before us is a poor way of demanding our rights. Such is neither socialism nor reform in any way, but rather symptoms of the disease that attacks a decaying race.

An evolving race does not get so easily afraid of progress, but presses onward in spite of her many blunders, correcting her defective policy to better the requirements of the times.

Socialism belongs to the evolving race. It is the getting into harmony with the evolving process in which life throbs unfold and mature for emancipation. It is neither extreme leisure nor unbearable hardship—both such are drawbacks on human progress.

Timely socialism is to utilize whatever manifestation we but up against, whether good or bad, capitalistic or otherwise, for its true value.

If capitalism acquire of us policies which if stuck to by posterity will be detrimental to them, we should realize that our supreme duty is to solve our present problems and to imbue posterity with spirit and stamina to solve theirs, so that whatever foolish legislation and regulation we today may enact or agree to will to them be, as Emerson says, "Like rope of sands that perish in the twisting."

We should bestow on posterity our practical skill without trying to befog their minds with our follies, but leave them free to drink of the fountain of pure knowledge flowing from the experience of ages.

As my point of view don't conform with either the republican or democrats of today, I judge I am a socialist—in fact, I love to see the socialist party grow great enough to frustrate the other parties' negation.
